COLLEGE Profile

Geelong Lutheran College Armstrong Creek is dedicated to improving the quality of education for all students under its care now and into the future. It is a Child Safe organisation with a zero tolerance for child abuse and is committed to acting in the best interests of children.

As a school of the Lutheran Church of Australia, we are dedicated to providing an education for our students that is informed by strong Christian principles and underpinned by the values that make our Lutheran schools across Australia unique. The College endeavours to maintain an established framework of Christian attitudes and relationships which permeate and integrate its entire life and work. This provides a strong basis for the initiative of Lifelong Learning.



This encourages living in community and reflecting characteristics of God through our core values of wisdom, honour and purpose.

Established in 2009, Geelong Lutheran College Armstrong Creek is situated in the urban growth area of the City of Greater Geelong, close to the Surf Coast area. The College celebrated its 14th anniversary in 2022. It is a Prep to Year 12 school offering a welcoming, lively and nurturing environment with a focus on providing a quality, Christian education. At GLC Armstrong Creek, we celebrate the diversity and giftedness of all within our community. Education is a learning journey in which we acknowledge parents, guardians and care givers as primary educators and feel privileged to join in partnership with them through their child's education.

The ministry and mission of the College provides the framework for our student wellbeing, teaching and learning programs. These programs enable us to foster a passion for learning and the holistic development of each child. Pastoral care is one of the main focuses, integrating personal and social wellbeing and resilience. Our students are challenged to think as global citizens, consider the needs of those beyond their local community and to recognise the responsibilities their education provides as they take their places in work, social and family networks of the 21st century.

MISSION & Ministry

Christian education is woven into every aspect of life at the College. We are proud of our distinctly Lutheran identity.

Central to the mission and ministry of the College is the teaching and learning of Christian Studies. Students from Prep through to Year 12 continued to develop their understandings of Christian faith and religions through weekly Christian Studies lessons. This has been supported by the Lutheran Education Australia Christian Studies Curriculum Framework. Our weekly chapel service continues to be a focal point for our students, staff and parents. Led by various members of our leadership, the Armstrong Creek Campus Pastor David Spike, students and staff, our worship services are a highlight which continue to allow each student to develop their faith journey. This is supported by staff devotion, morning devotions in classes, student homegroups and opening and closing services during the year.


Staff continue to be enriched in their faith journey through the Equip program for Christian Studies teachers. Teachers of Christian Studies are required to complete this important program which has been developed by Lutheran Education Australia in conjunction with the Church and schools.

Serving our community continues to be a focal point throughout the College with activities spread across the year levels. We support a number of projects of the Australian Lutheran World Service, which is the overseas aid and development agency of the Lutheran Church of Australia.

TEACHER STANDARDS & QUALIFICATIONS

Geelong Lutheran College Armstrong Creek values the dedication and experience of its staff.

In 2022, GLC Armstrong Creek had a total of 121 staff with 71 of these actively involved in the work of teaching. Staff are trained to support student learning.

The school is committed to ensuring that staff are employed with appropriate qualifications and who will actively support the Christian ethos of the school. The school continuously develops the staff both professionally and personally through relevant professional growth opportunities.

All teachers at GLC Armstrong Creek are appropriately qualified and hold registration with the Victorian Institute of Teaching. All staff members are trained in LEA's Valuing Safe Communities to ensure compliance with the Lutheran Church of Australia requirements. An approved Child Protection training program has been implemented for all staff and volunteers in the school which is undertaken at the beginning of each year. New employees to the school are trained as part of staff Induction. Relevant staff members are also trained or updated in First Aid, Anaphylaxis Management and Asthma Management.








STUDENT ATTENDANCE AT SCHOOL 2022

To support student attendance, the College has an Attendance Policy that outlines the roles and responsibilities of the school staff, parents and students.

- Absences are shown 'live' each day via roll marking in SIMON,
- Parents of absent students are notified if communication has not been forthcoming,
- Unexplained or inadequately explained absences will result in communication with parents and students,
- A formal attendance meeting may be organised to resolve ongoing attendance trends and discuss how best to support future attendance and engagement,
- Student attendance and absence figures may appear on student academic reports,
- Aggregated student attendance data is reported to the Department of Education & Training.

SENIOR SECONDARY OUTCOMES

We were very proud of all Year 12 students for their motivation, hard work and leadership provided within the school. The College also acknowledges our teaching staff who professionally guided and supported our students.

Of the cohort of 44 Year 12 students, 36 were set to finalise their VCE in 2022; of which there was a 100% VCE pass rate. Of the remaining 8 students, 8 earned their Senior VCAL certificate.

Of the 32 students who applied for University place through VTAC, 31 were awarded a university placement, with 21 receiving their first preference of university.

Geelong Lutheran College Armstrong Creek continues to operate based on a sound financial position.


