3 & 4 YEAR OLD KINDERGARTEN

St John's Lutheran Kindergarten offers a Victorian government-approved Kindergarten program with qualified early childhood teachers and educators, who seek to develop each child's full potential in their early years.

Kindergarten offers a play-based program in a fun and welcoming environment. The benefits of early childhood education in the years before school are far-reaching. Kindergarten provides experiences for children to grow and develop their social and emotional skills through learning and interaction with others.

Children from 3-years-old to school age have access to two years of quality, funded kindergarten. Neuroscience shows that early brain development is critical in shaping the learning development, health and well-being of children, and impacts on their future life opportunities.

Our Kindergarten program offers your child an exciting world of adventure, creativity, and learning.

3-Year-old Kindergarten

St John's Lutheran Kindergarten currently offer two options of funded 3-Year-old Kindergarten: 1 full day or 2 full days. Daily sessions are 7.5 hours and two-day positions are quite limited.

4-Year-old Kindergarten

St John's Lutheran Kindergarten currently offers 2 full days (15 hours per week) of funded 4-Year-old Kindergarten for all enrolled children.

In 2024, kindergarten sessions run from 8.15am – 3.45pm. It is expected 2025 sessions will run to a similar timetable.

PRIMARY PREP - YEAR 6

Learning environments in the Primary School are nurturing and supportive of individuals and their developmental needs and strengths. Our approach is informed and driven by our Christian faith and our candidacy as an International Baccalaureate (IB) Primary Years Program (PYP) candidate school. These foundations embrace a transdisciplinary inquiry-based approach to teaching and learning, in the context of a collaborative and relational learning environment. In addition, a strong focus on core literacy and numeracy plays a key role in our students' growth and development.

Students become internationally-minded citizens as they develop the attributes of the IB Learner Profile and engage in deep learning focused on issues and concepts of global significance. We have an emphasis on empathy, action and sustainability. These learning emphases come to life within the formal curriculum, wider school activities and events as well as in many everyday interactions and informal learning moments.

- A program of transdisciplinary inquiry, in which students investigate in depth significant concepts under the themes of:

Transdisciplinary units of inquiry draw on relevant content, understandings and skills from the Australian Curriculum areas of:

- · Technologies (Digital and Design)
- · Health and PE
- Christian Studies (Lutheran Education Australia curriculum)
- · Languages (French K-6)

Specialist teachers have valuable input into the learning in these units of inquiry, adding authentic depth to the experiences.
